2. Words are spelled as they appear in the edition of 1600. Obvious printing errors have been corrected.
3. The key signatures are as they appear in the original.
4. Additional bar lines have been used.
5. Fermatas do not appear in all the parts in the original.
6. The original is laid out for a group of singers/players around a table, with the words of the first verse under the music of each part. The remaining verses are printed out once, separately.
7. A "fayer" is one who cleanses.
8. Songs numbered I to VIII are two-part songs.
